

## Full-Time Lecturer, Chemical Engineering University of Washington

Employment Grade: Temporary Lecturer Full-Time (Chemical Engineering)

We seek a full time (100% FTE) Lecturer for the 2020-21 academic year. The position is a non-tenure track, 1 term appointment (9-month service period), renewable in future years subject to availability of funds.

The candidate must have a PhD in Chemical Engineering or several years of relevant teaching experience across the chemical engineering curriculum. The individual must be capable of teaching a range of classes in the Chemical Engineering curriculum, and must have familiarity with a variety of laboratory instrumentation. The position is primarily focused on teaching with a small service component.

Specific duties include:

1. Teaching (3) laboratory and lecture courses in Chemical Engineering Unit Operations
2. Stewardship and responsibility for UO lab equipment, possibly including writing small internal grants or developing new experiments
3. Teaching a range of undergraduate courses in the undergraduate Chemical Engineering curriculum

Applications should consist of a single pdf file containing a cover letter, curriculum vitae, statement teaching experience and interests (2 page max), and any evidence of teaching effectiveness (5 page max) you wish the committee to review.
