ABSTRACT:

What NSF solicitation should I apply to? Why are there so many options? When should I apply? Are there tricks that I can do to make my application more successful? Can I talk to a program officer before I apply? These questions and many more are asked by potential proposers to NSF. This talk will explore what is happening in Information and Intelligent Systems science now and some helpful tips on how to think about and apply for NSF grants.

Dr. Wendy Nilsen is the Deputy Division Director for the Division of Information and Intelligent Systems. She previously also served as Acting Deputy Division Director for the Division of Industrial Innovations and Partnerships and r the Division of Engineering and Education Centers in the Directorate for Engineering. Wendy has been widely recognized across the Federal government as a leader in health technology research. She has long led the Smart Health program, which is a coalition involving seven NSF divisions across four directorates, as well as twenty-three NIH Institutes and Centers. She also leads the Digital Health Research and Development Federal Interagency Working Group, and in that role led the drafting of the Federal Health Information Technology Research and Development Strategic Framework. Prior to joining NSF, she was a Health Scientist Administrator in the Office of the Director at the National Institutes of Health.
